

Emily White: What was your first experience with Jelly's Last Jam?

Robert O'Hara: I saw the original Broadway production in 1992, right after I moved to New York to attend graduate school. I can remember sitting in the balcony and having my mind blown from start to finish. It was incredible and solidified, for me, that I wanted to be a director, but also that I wanted to work with George C. Wolfe.

I have a long history with George. He has been a mentor for most of my professional life, and he gave me my first start in the business. And with this Encores! presentation of Jelly's Last Jam, George has been there from the beginning, guiding me. It's a very difficult and exciting piece about one man's legacy and his relationship to his culture.

EW: Why is Jelly's Last Jam so important in the overall musical theater canon?

RO: Because it was a Broadway show with a Black protagonist that wasn't interested in making audiences comfortable. It's about black genius. It examines the light and the dark. It was sexy. It was hilarious. It was incredibly moving, joyful to watch and painful at times. And that is why it meant so much to me, because I had rarely seen that level of excellence.

It is profoundly moving to me that I have the ability to do just this little bit of reincarnation. How many people get the chance, 30 years after they've seen the original, to actually work on a revival of it, and to have the ability to communicate with the people who created it? That is a rare gift, I think.

EW: Can you tell me a little bit more about Jelly Roll Morton himself – a historical figure who was not the nicest individual? RO: Well history is littered with historical figures who weren't very nice. But Jelly Roll Morton's contradiction of character starts with his proximity to whiteness. He was Creole and incredibly light-skinned. He was sexist, prejudiced, colorist, misogynist, and elitist. He was also a musical genius. And his music lives on in this show. There are new arrangements by the great Luther Henderson, but for the most part this is Jelly's music, and Susan Birkenhead is also a lyrical genius.

Jelly's Last Jam is a musical about and performed by Black people that are not simply there to make your toes tap, but also to say something about the virus of racism. This musical shows us what humanity looks like. And humanity is oftentimes difficult to reckon with, even in musical form.

EW: What does it mean to you to have Jelly's Last Jam onstage during Black History Month?

RO: Every month for me is Black History Month, so the show being in February is not anything significant to me. But I think that if it means that a more diverse group of people will see it, then that's exciting to me.

We as artists are here to reflect on the human condition. The human condition is messy and difficult to take in. So I think it's a celebration, because Black people are complicated, just like everybody else is complicated. We're not a monolith, and so the celebration is in the complication, is in the contradictions.

I think that's why the musical is so brilliant. It's an act of artistry and creative impulse that we're able to put something so large and so celebratory on stage, and yet still see behind the curtain, see behind the man, to take Jelly and the audience on this journey of his life through the rearview mirror. As the musical says, it's a journey to save his soul.

JELLY ROLL MORTON (Music) (1891—1941) Ferdinand Le Menthe "Jelly Roll" Morton was born into the Creole gentry of New Orleans in 1891, but was irresistibly drawn to the excitement of the infamous Storyville district where he made his reputation as a pianist. At a young age he left New Orleans to travel the country, landing in Chicago in the 1920s. He and his band, The Red Hot Peppers, became the top Black recording artists for RCA Records in 1927—28. Morton's music integrated the sounds of ragtime, blues, African rhythms, and French opera, establishing him as one of the great jazz pioneers, but by 1930 his music was considered old hat. He died in Los Angeles in 1941.

SUSAN BIRKENHEAD (Lyrics) received a Tony Nomination, a Grammy nomination and a Drama Desk Award for her lyrics for *Jelly's Last Jam*. She was nominated for a Drama Desk Award for *Triumph of Love*, and won a Drama

Desk Award and a Tony nomination for Working. She won an Outer Critics Circle award for What About Luv, and an LA Drama Critics Award for Minsky's. She wrote additional lyrics and new songs for the Broadway version of High Society, and wrote songs for the Off-Broadway Stars of David, and A My Name Is Alice. The Secret Life of Bees, which she wrote with Lynn Nottage and Duncan Sheik, directed by Whitney White, played the Almeida Theatre in London this past year, and BOOP!, which she wrote with Bob Martin and David Foster, directed by Jerry Mitchell, just played in Chicago prior to a 2025 Broadway opening.

LUTHER HENDERSON (Arrangements & Orchestrations) (1919–2003) At an early age, Luther Henderson's family moved to Harlem and became neighbors with Duke Ellington, who became a major influence in his life. After his 1942 graduation from The Juilliard School and later New York University graduate study, he adapted and orchestrated Éllington's symphonic works-"Harlem," "Three Black Kings," and his Broadway musical Beggar's Holiday. Ellington later referred to him as his "classical arm." Henderson worked on more than 50 Broadway productions, television shows, and recordings: Ain't Misbehavin', Lena Horne: The Lady and Her Music, Raisin, Play On, Jelly's Last Jam, Flower Drum Song, Do Re Mi, Funny Girl, and No, No Nanette. For Jelly's Last Jam, he rearranged Jelly Roll Morton's jazz compositions and musical fragments into a hit musical. Henderson received Emmy nominations for his work on several productions. Shortly before his passing, Henderson received recognition as a 2004 National Endowment of the Arts "Jazz Master."

DARYL WATERS (Score Consultant. Additional Orchestrations) was the Music Supervisor/Orchestrator/Arranger for the City Center Gala presentation of Pal Joey. He received Tony and Drama Desk Orchestration awards for Memphis. Recent credits: Orchestrator, Water for Elephants; Co-Orchestrator, New York, New York (Tony nomination); and Music Supervisor/Arranger, BOOP! The Betty Boop Musical. 
